


Jane Alden Stevens, (above) Moon Phases, (above right) Memorial #1, (right) Blessed

In 1991, I began to create a series of photographs in response to the intense personal experiences a small group of women friends and I began having at the time, all of which related to our aging, fertility, and family changes.
